### Pilots-a-Plenty for 2012

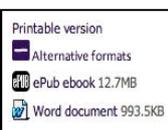
The first two pilots using the Learning to Learn (L2L) material completed in November 2011 and at the time of publication a further ten are either in progress or are committed to use L2L or Succeed with Math (SWiM). Fifty additional institutions in the US have indicated a serious interest to commit to the pilot process. Our Project Managers and researchers are being kept on their toes by the encouraging uptake!

### Alternative Formats

Because B2S content has been rendered for the web using the Open University's XML schema, users can simply create an alternative version of the content that they can "take away" with them! Every unit of both L2L and SWiM can be rendered as an ebook, or Word document, that is created and downloaded onto the user's device, or a printable version: all the content is beautifully rendered for print without the need for website navigation and tools. Any videos created by the OU



are also included in the resulting file (embedded YouTube videos are not) to ensure it is as dynamic a learning experience as the online version. The process takes seconds, and provides a portable ebook or Word document that can be read offline.

### Research and Reflection

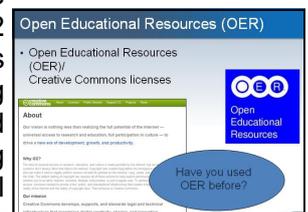
With SWiM content about to go live and new pilots about to commence the project is now entering a research intensive phase. Team members will be evaluating the experiences of participating students and instructors through interviews and surveys, and looking at the types of institutions which have chosen to make use of B2S courses. Assessment of the adaptation process is another key area the team is evaluating and, in addition to learning design analysis of both courses, the materials are also undergoing accessibility and usability testing. A research visit to Maryland at the end of March 2012 is currently being planned by the team.



At the beginning of this month B2S content had been visited by over 700 unique users, of which 236 had registered to use L2L materials.

### Webinar Series

Continuing the success of the 2011 webinar series, 2012 has begun with an ambitious program. Two exciting webinars were presented during January: "Adopting B2S Open Educational Resources (OER) for your Educational Program" with the US Project Manager David Lascu and "Have it your way: Remixing and Wrapping OER to suit your learners' needs" with members of the Research team.
